Parent Collaboration Night was on Tuesday, August 29, and was a huge success! Families enjoyed the chance to get to learn about what their child's day is like at Westgate. Some of the topics that were covered were reading, math, Student notebooks, PBIS School-Wide Expectations, and the best iPad apps to use at home. If you were able to join us, we hope that you found the time valuable. If you weren't able to join us this year, we hope that you will be able to join us for future events at Westgate.

Each month we will have a Gator Assembly which is a time that we recognize our Gators of the Month, review social skills or expectations with the whole school, and draw student names from the Gator Buck Bins that students have been entering in throughout the month. Student Dress Code

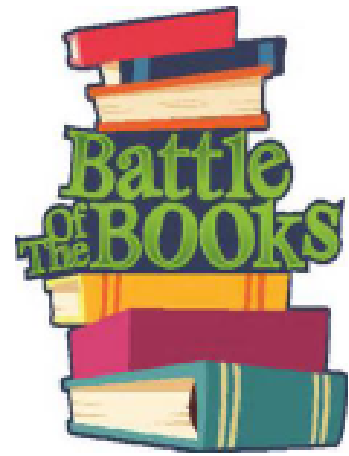
Students in the Westside Community Schools are expected to dress in a way that is appropriate for the school setting.

Students should not dress in a manner that is dangerous to the health and safety of anyone or interferes with the learning environment or teaching process in our school. Following is a list of examples of attire that will not be considered appropriate; this list is not exclusive, and other forms of attire may be deemed by the Principal to be inappropriate for the school setting:

1. Clothing that shows an inappropriate amount of bare skin or underwear (midriffs, spaghetti straps, sagging pants) or clothing that is too tight, revealing or baggy, or tops and bottoms that do not overlap or any material that is sheer or lightweight enough to be seen through, or otherwise of an appropriate size and fit so as to be revealing or drag on the ground;
2. Shorts, skirts, etc. that do not reach mid-thigh or longer;
3. Sleepwear and slippers, including pajama bottoms, and costumes, unless part of a school-sponsored activity;
4. Clothing or jewelry that advertises or promotes beer, alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs;
5. Clothing or jewelry that could be used as a weapon (chains, spiked apparel) or that would encourage “horse-play” or that would damage property (e.g. cleats);
6. Head wear including hats, caps, bandannas, and scarves;
7. Clothing or jewelry which exhibits nudity, makes sexual references or carries lewd, indecent, or vulgar double meaning;
8. Clothing or jewelry that is gang related.

Consideration will be made for students who wear special clothing as required by religious beliefs, disability, or to convey a particularized message protected by law. The final decision regarding attire and grooming will be made by the Principal. In the event a student is uncertain as to whether a particular item or method of grooming is consistent with the school’s guidelines, the student or student’s parent/guardian should contact the Principal for approval.

The Westside Community Council will once again sponsor the Battle of the Books for the 2017-2018 school year. This event is open to all 4th through 6th grade students in the District.



Battle of the Books is a team competition where students work with their teammates to answer questions about the books from the list below. All questions are of the form "In which book...?" Students answer with the book's title and author.

Teams consist of three to five students, but at most four students may compete in any round of the competition. Each team is guaranteed at least 2 rounds of competition. Since this is a team event, individual students do not have to read all the books on the list in order to participate.

Registration will run from November 3rd through November 21st. Please see your November school newsletter for registration information. The battle will be held March 24, 2018 at Westside Middle School.
